CMMC staff offer many reasons to support Cancer Center project

It's a shocking statistic: One in three people in the U.S. will receive a cancer diagnosis at some point in their lives.

For those who have first-hand experience with the stress and fear that diagnosis brings, or who have comforted loved ones during treatment, supporting Central Montana Medical Center's (CMMC) campaign to build a cancer center is an easy decision.

"It's been my complete privilege to work with many of the donors of this campaign," said CMMC Foundation Director Abby Franks. "It's humbling and inspiring to hear the selfless reasons about why they choose to give, and we thank each one."

Many CMMC employees are financially supporting the cancer center campaign with recurring gifts. There are currently 93 staff members giving to the campaign: nearly all through payroll deduction!

Some of CMMC's finest, Barb Berg, Ashley Senter and Dr. Tamara Welsh, shared why they support the project. All are on the CMMC Cancer Center Campaign Committee, and Dr. Welsh also serves on the CMMC Governing Board.

Barb works as a triage nurse at CMMC and recognizes the importance of regular mammograms. In December 2020, she went in for her routine appointment and this time, the 3D mammogram revealed a tiny, cancerous spot. CMMC's Surgeon Dr. Scott Smith did the prep work and lumpectomy at CMMC, but Barb had to travel to Billings for radiation and follow-up appointments.

"I was lucky; I have a daughter who lives in Billings who I stayed with for my 16 treatments, and I didn't have to drive back and forth for four and a half weeks," Barb said. "But that's a long time to not be in your own house and sleep in your own bed." Barb utilized what she calls her "sabbatical," to make quilts that she donated to CMMC to raise funds for the 3D mammo campaign that was ongoing at that time.

Barb said dealing with the stress of travel for treatment is extremely difficult for many cancer patients, noting the hardships for those who don't have support of friends and family or have difficulty traveling.

"I think this cancer center is vital to our medical community and com-

munity in general," Barb said, adding that having a thriving healthcare facility brings and keeps people in town, which benefits the economy.

CMMC Nutritional Director Ashley Senter was diagnosed with stage 3 melanoma in 2017. She went through four cycles of immunotherapy, driving two hours for treatment, before she had to stop when the treatment attacked her liver. Once they got her liver back to normal function, she had surgery, followed by six weeks of bed rest. She's thankful to have been in remission since early 2018.

"I don't have kids so that was one less thing to worry about, but had to cut down on my work and go to per diem," she said. Ashley wasn't living in Lewistown then

but understands the burdens of having to travel for medical treatment. "It takes a toll financially and mentally. Having a cancer center here will make a huge difference!"

Dr. Welsh has been part of the CMMC community since March 2007, spending three years as a family practitioner before fulfilling her calling as a full-time Emergency Room physician in October 2010. Through the years she's treated many cancer patients. "Having cancer in and of itself is stressful," Dr. Welsh said. "Finding ways to make it less stressful contributes to the patient's overall well-being."

As a member of CMMC's Governing Board, she's been involved in the decision to move forward to build the cancer center (see related story on Page 4) and said that without the \$9 million commitment from Helmsley Charitable Trust, the project wouldn't have been feasible. "There's certainly a need to have the ability to do more cancer treatment here," she said, adding that the Helmsley representatives saw that need and came to CMMC with the offer to help.

Dr. Welsh and her husband, Scott, are financially supporting the cancer center project because they believe it's the right thing to do. "Some of us see our donations as a kindness to our neighbors," she said. "If we can help in the recovery of even one person; that's huge."

Central Montana Foundation welcomes Scott Chauvet to its board

Scott said he's excited to be part of the CMF Board of Directors and recognizes the great responsibility that comes with the volunteer position. He's worked with similar boards in Stanford and served with the Big Sandy Hospital Foundation.

"I realize the good they do and the value they put into a community," he said. "I'm excited to work with the other leaders in the community and really be able to contribute. This board has such strong representation." ❖

Couple demonstrates love of their community with Cancer Center gifts

Rollin (Rolly) and Denise Nelson recently presented the Central Montana Medical Center (CMMC) with a generous “now and later” gift to benefit the Cancer Center project.

The Nelsons gave an outright gift and set up a deferred charitable gift annuity (DGA) that will go the Cancer Center endowment at the end of a five-year deferment.

The couple chose to transfer mutual funds, which were then liquidated and split between the outright gift and the DGA held by Central Montana Foundation (CMF). By setting up the annuity that will go to a permanent endowment for the cancer center, the couple was able to take a Montana Endowment Tax Credit, as well as a federal charitable deduction.

“I would encourage people to learn more about the Montana Endowment Tax Credit from a financial professional or by contacting CMF,” Rolly said. “There are some real significant tax benefits.”

The Nelsons said there are several reasons why they chose to support the CMMC Cancer Center project. “We have a lot of respect for Central Montana and the people that live here, and we wanted to give back to those people,” Rolly said. “We believe CMMC is such a viable part of our community and having this new service to offer is an incredible opportunity.”

The couple have agonized with close family and friends battling cancer and believe that having the option to stay close to home for treatment rather than dealing with the stress and expense of travel and lodging will be of huge benefit. “I hope that neither Denise nor I will have to use the Cancer Center, but if by chance we do, we know that it would make things easier for our family to have those services available locally,” Rolly said.

The Nelsons have a long giving history to Central Montana projects.

“We’re big believers in helping others,” Rolly said. “We both grew up in family without a lot of extra money and we are blessed in that we can give.”

They also expressed their desire that their giving will inspire others to do the same. “No matter what the amount of the gift, we hope others will give to this very worthwhile project in our community.”

The Nelsons have been Lewistown residents since 1990 when Rolly moved his Edward Jones office here. At the time, the couple was living in California but wanted to come “home” to Montana. Rolly is originally from Havre and Denise from Billings, and they had spent time and

felt like Lewistown was the ideal place to raise a family. That ended up being a very good decision, according to the couple.

The Edward Jones business thrived and by the time Rolly retired in 2021, there were four Edward Jones offices in Lewistown. Denise was plugged into the community as well, teaching math and French for 19 years in the Lewistown School District before her retirement in 2012.

The Nelsons raised their three children in Lewistown, including twins Mallory and Devin, and son, Craig, and said they enjoyed the years being involved in their activities, including a variety of sports. They are now enjoying the next season of life and have one grandson.

The couple said they have strived to be good role models to their children and in the community, including showing generosity. Their gift to the Cancer Center is especially meaningful to them as they believe it will save lives. Public invited to Central Montana Foundation Annual Meeting May 23

Central Montana Foundation (CMF) Board of Directors invites the public to its Annual Meeting and luncheon set for Tuesday, May 23 at noon at the Yogo Inn in Lewistown.

CMF has granted millions of funds to not-for-profit and tax-exempt organizations for medical, essential services, educational, civic, cultural and recreational projects since it was founded in 1984.

All of the funding for CMF’s grant-making activities is from the dividends and interest earned from its unrestricted permanent endowments.

The principal remains untouched, providing a source of income into perpetuity!

There are 12 unrestricted endowments, the largest of which is the Mildred Bryte Memorial. Mildred died in 1997 and left the bulk of her more than \$3 million estate to CMF. At least 60% of the Bryte income is used to fund major grants at the May annual meeting. Income from the other 40% of the endowment funds annual gifts to the 11 rural endowments under CMF’s umbrella. Any remaining income is available for monthly distribution.

CMF’s Board of Directors consider major grant requests just once per year at the annual meeting, and each applicant will have opportunity to give a short presentation. Other agenda items include reports on 2022 activities and financials, and presentation of a “Friend of the Foundation” award.

The public is invited and encouraged to attend, but are asked to make reservations by May 18. For more information call CMF Executive Director Carrie Mantooth in the CMF office at 406.538.6130. ❖

CMMC Cancer Center project is gaining momentum!

Central Montana Medical Center's (CMMC) Cancer Center project is gaining momentum, with more than \$1.5 million already raised in pledges and donations.

The project will go out to bid in March and bids are expected by April.

"We are incredibly grateful to those who have stepped forward to contribute to our campaign to bring comprehensive cancer care to Central Montana," said CMMC CEO Cody Langbehn. "And we are very encouraged with the overwhelming generosity our community has shown so far. Once we have firm construction bids in hand, we will continue to share with the public where we are and how we move forward."

CMMC's Cancer Center project will be largely funded by a \$9 million grant from the Helmsley Charitable Trust. Another \$2.5 million will come from grants and CMMC financing and reserves, with the final \$2 million from the local fundraising campaign goal. Total cost of the cancer center is estimated at \$13.5 million with another \$3 million in possible additions for a total estimated project cost of \$16.5 million.

Funding of the potential additional alternates could be made possible by surpassing the \$2 million local goal, according to CMMC Foundation Director Abby Franks. Larger budget items that fall on the alternates list include a CT simulation

scanner, updating the aging HVAC system, as well as finishing out the CMMC Cancer Center Pharmacy and additional treatment rooms.

The Cancer Center Campaign is currently in a "quiet phase working with donors who have shown interest," Abby said. She said a public campaign is expected to be launched in May once the final bids have been received and the local fundraising campaign can come to the community with confirmed costs.

Abby praised the efforts of the CMMC Can-

cer Center Committee led by chair Scot Solberg, who can be reached at 406.366.4369, and vice chair, Dave Byerly, at 406.366.0131. "They are totally committed to seeing this project to fruition because they recognize how impactful it will be on so many levels."

CMMC grants nearly \$35,000 for equipment and other needs

Central Montana Medical Center Foundation (MCF) Advisory Board recommended nearly \$35,000 in grants over the last few months to improve physical and mental health, and provide emergency assistance to two CMMC employees.

Grants awarded include:

- **For an EKG machine, \$11,200:** This grant was made possible by the donations to the respiratory care and general funds with CMMC Foundation. An EKG machine records the electrical signal from the heart to check for different heart conditions. This will provide a second machine to CMMC to help better cover the needs of CMMC's patients.

- **Stair Stepper and Elliptical, \$16,260:** Funding for this grant is from donations to

the Cardiac Rehab and CMMC General Fund. The lower level of CMMC houses a 1,000 sq. ft. area that serves the health and wellness of cardiac patients. The center is equipped with wellness machines including cardio machines and weight equipment. This purchase helps to keep machines current and safe, according to CMMC Foundation Director Abby Franks.

- **Mental Resilience for Volunteer Emergency Medical Services (MRVEMS), \$5,000:** This grant award was made possible through donations to the Friends of First Responders and CMMC General Fund. "CMMC Foundation supported this group who will work to provide mental health counseling, beyond a typical debriefing, to lessen the impact of secondary trauma and increase resiliency for these volun-

teers on their jobs," Abby explained.

- **HOPE for CMMC employees in crisis situations, \$2,000:** This grant helped two employees in crisis emergency situations. At CMMC a fund exists called the HOPE Fund that is primarily supported through employee giving to help co-workers in crisis or emergency. The fund is overseen by an employee committee and all names of recipients are anonymous to the committee as a whole.

Central Montana Community Concert has a new fund with CMF

Central Montana Community Concert Association is working hard to continue an 82-year history of providing top-tier performances in Lewistown.

Central Montana Foundation (CMF) approved the establishment of a permanent endowment for the organization at its February meeting. Community Concert organizers are hopeful that the public will be generous with their support for this new fund.

Central Montana Community Concert officers attending CMF's February meeting said they've seen a significant decrease in membership, while the costs of getting the performers to Lewistown, lodging and meals, is on the rise.

They were awarded a CMF grant (see related story below) to help increase visibility in hopes of seeing a revival in membership and support.

Central Montana Community Concerts provide the opportunity for local residents to experience unique cultural experiences of music and per-



forming arts during a concert series. The public can purchase membership in support of Central Montana Community Concert Association, which provides access to the concerts and the option to add a patron gift to help with expenses.

A variety of genres are featured during the concert series. This year's line-up included an a cappella group, a classical pianist and a jazz trio. The final concert Sat., April 29 is "A Celebration of the Music of Chicago," at 7:30 p.m. in the FHS Center for the Performing Arts. For this concert only, there will be a complimentary admission for those accompanying a guest or member.

Central Montana Foundation Directors had busy start to 2023

Central Montana Foundation (CMF) Board of Directors granted funds to seven local organizations during the first two meetings in 2023.

CMF grants are funded from income earned on CMF's unrestricted permanent endowments including, CMF General, Mildred Bryte Memorial, Margie Wilkins, Bertha Martin, John & Alice Janicek, Rosie Pense, Chester Rickner, Gertrude Saxtorph, Jr. Housel Family, Sally Wells, George Mueller and Terry Bragg estates:

Grants awarded include:

- **Winnett ACES, \$1,000:** The grant will help with an addition to the 55 Main Building (formerly known as the Odd Fellows Hall), which will provide a public convenience facility on Main Street in Winnett. The annex will have ADA accessible shower rooms, bathrooms, and a laundry facility to be used by visitors both locally and those traveling through.

- **Central Montana Community Concert Association, \$4,608:** This grant will assist the Central Montana Community Concert Association in its efforts to increase community awareness. The organization is experiencing a decrease in membership and representatives are striving to continue offering top-tier performances in Lewistown. The plan to increase visibility through the media and more mailings and promotional materials utilizing local-owned businesses. They are also offering a one-time complimentary admission to those accompanied by a guest or member to the final performance this year, "A Celebration of the Music of Chicago," April 29 at 7:30 p.m. at FHS Performing Arts Center

- **Fergus After Prom Parents, \$2,500:** CMF Board of Directors has

supported this project to help with expenses of FHS's after-prom party for many years. The party is for juniors and seniors from FHS and their guests and provides a fun, safe environment to socialize with classmates, enjoy games, refreshments, and win a plethora of prizes.

- **Fergus/Petroleum 4-H Horse Committee, \$2,500:** This grant was awarded to help with clinician fees for upcoming ranch horse clinics for local 4-H members participating in Working Ranch Horse and Performance Horse Shows.

- **Friendship Lodge #37, \$1,150:** A grant was awarded for the organization's Bikes for Books Program during which 10 bikes are given away to local students to emphasize and reward the value of reading.

- **Lewistown Junior High School, \$4,999:** This CMF grant will help with the purchase of a desperately needed piano at LJHS. A keyboard is currently being used during music classes as the existing piano is about 70-years-old and not repairable.

- **Winnett Swimming Pool, \$1,128:** The CMF grant will help with an overall pool rehabilitation project. The CMF funds will be used to powder coat new metal fence posts surrounding the Winnett Swimming Pool and purchase a roll-up door to replace the plywood doors on the pump room. These items are part of a larger \$280,000 pool renovation project.

Judith Basin County Sheriff Office establishes K9 fund with CMF

Judith Basin County Sheriff's Office (JBCSO) will soon have another member on staff when they bring on a K9 trained in narcotics detection and apprehension.

Judith Basin County Sheriff Tim Wilhelms said they're seeing an increase in drug-related offenses and hope having a K9 program will help stem the tide.

"We've seen an increase in fentanyl and meth coming this way from the Mexican border," Tim said. "Highway 87 between Great Falls and Billings is a route for drug traffickers, so there's a need for this dog for sure."

JBCSO kicked the K9 program off thanks to a very generous donation from Wolf Creek Honey of Stanford. "They reached out to us and wanted to make a donation to our department specifically for a dog program," Tim said, expressing his gratitude to them for being the catalyst to launch the program.



Judith Basin County Undersheriff Richard Hayes will be the handler for the department's K9. He will meet Aramis at a six-week training in Pennsylvania this spring.



The next step for JBCSO was to apply to Central Montana Foundation (CMF) to establish a permanent endowment to deposit the donation and provide an easy way for donors to give tax deductible charitable donations to support the K9 program. Their request for a fund was approved in December.

"We're not using any taxpayer money for the K9 program," emphasized Tim. Donations and grants will cover the cost of acquisition of the K9, training with the K9 for handler, outfitting the patrol vehicle for a K9, veterinarian, food costs and other expenses.

Aramis is a trained Malinois, who will meet and work with handler Undersheriff Richard Hayes at Shallow Creek Kennels in Pennsylvania for an intensive six weeks of training this spring.

Brunemeyers fund scholarship for FHS girl basketball players

A 50-year history of coaching female athletes was Bill Brunemeyer's motivation for setting up a new scholarship with Central Montana Foundation (CMF) for Fergus High School (FHS) varsity girls basketball players.

The Bill and Diane Brunemeyer Scholarship will make its first award this spring to a FHS graduating senior who participated in girls basketball. In the event that no basketball players apply, the scholarship may be awarded to a FHS Girls Fastpitch player.

Bill and his wife, Diane, are both graduates of FHS. Bill moved to Lewistown with his family from Billings in 1956 and graduated in 1960. Diane Ruegg grew up in Lewistown and graduated in 1961.

The couple both graduated college at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff and spent their careers in education at Ukiah High School in northern California. Bill was a history and government teacher for 33 years and Diane was the girls' athletic director and physical education instructor.

"I retired from coaching in 2018," Bill said. "For at least 50 years I was coaching at least one sport. I really enjoyed coaching girls. None of them belong to the NBA or professional ranks, but they all worked hard and were very coachable. I have a soft spot in my heart for girl athletes."

The Brunemeyers maintained their connection to their hometown, faithfully returning for Christmas and summer vacations. They are enjoying their retirement at their home in Redwood Valley, Calif., but spend their summers in Diane's family home in Lewistown.

"We appreciate the Brunemeyers' commitment to helping young people reach their higher educational goals," said CMF Executive Director Carrie Mantooth. "With the rising cost of tuition, scholarships like this one are more important to their success than ever before."

CMMC installs new state-of-the-art MRI equipment

Central Montana Medical Center (CMMC) upgraded its Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) in December thanks in part to a little help from its friends.

Donations to Medical Center Foundation (MCF) funds provided \$500,000 of the total cost of about \$1.5 million for the new MRI.

"With the MRI Machine at CMMC having more than 1,000 uses each year, and those uses having a direct correlation in the health and treatment of our community members, the Medical Center Foundation is proud to have utilized donated funds to make this project a reality," says MCF Director Abby Franks.

CMMC Radiology Supervisor Geri Rector said the new MRI has some major advantages over old technology; including speed and roominess for patient comfort.



The new MRI machine was installed at CMMC in late 2022 and has many advantages over the old equipment.

"With the new MRI system we are able to apply a metal reduction software to some scans that help with visualizing the anatomy better when someone has had back surgery or joint replacements, as an example," Geri said.

She added, "Also, we have software that helps with the ability to speed up some of the scans if needed to help a patient get through a study faster. The image quality is so much better than the previous system due to the software upgrades we were able to have on the new system. The biggest bonus is the size of the bore where the patient is laying is larger and not as confining as our last scanner."

Updating this major piece of medical equipment at CMMC is just one way that MCF is fulfilling its mission to support the health services, programs, and practitioners of Central Montana, Abby said.
