Community Paramedicine referrals:

- Identify and eliminate health disparities.
- Decrease healthcare costs
- Decrease use of Emergency Resources and reroute the patient through the primary care provider.
- Decrease non-essential ambulance transports.
- Provide education and health promotion programs.
- Provide and encourage integration with local public health agencies, home health agencies, and other providers.

Our Services:

Patient Education and Scheduled Home Visits:

- Medication compliance
- Healthy lifestyle changes
- Nutritional Support
- Home Environment and Safety Needs
- Behavioral Health Support

Unscheduled Home Visits and 9-1-1 Responses:

Enrolled patients are tracked and in the event of a 911 call to their residence the Community
Paramedic will be dispatched with first responders. The CP may be able intervene and prevent an unnecessary ambulance transport.

Acute Illness and Injury Follow Up:

- Patient is referred from Emergency Department when observational admission is considered.
- Under ED medical direction the Community Paramedic provides in home monitoring, assessment, and episodic care for patient after ED discharge until follow up appointment with PCP.
