

Financials Total Base Projec


Total Base Project Cost: \$15.6 million \$14,731,863 secured \$868,137 remains

Since the Central Montana Medical Center (CMMC) was incorporated in 1969 – the facility, staff, equipment, and services have grown to meet the needs of our Central Montana community. Each year CMMC serves our area through important services ranging from Hospice and Home Health to the Emergency Room, Clinic Services to Physical Therapy, just to name a few.

These important services are provided, and the growth of the hospital, is due to YOU. You are the community who loves and invests in this important asset, our hospital.

Central Montana Medical Center is working to provide much-needed additional services to the Central Montana community by building a high-quality, comprehensive Cancer Center.

Through collaboration with the Billings Clinic Cancer Center, patients in Central Montana will soon have access to services presently only available in larger communities, including clinical trials and participation in national research with access to the latest treatments.

The Cancer Center base project cost is \$15.6 million with an additional \$2.5 million of hoped-for significant enhancements.

Philanthropic generosity has been key in making this project a reality.

Catalyst was the Helmsley Charitable Trust, which sees cancer care as a significant need in Central Montana. To demonstrate their commitment to improving healthcare in rural communities, they have made a \$9 million gift to CMMC to help build a Cancer Center.

The Central Montana Medical Center Foundation has already raised \$3.6 million through the community campaign, much of which was raised when generous donors, Larry and Kathleen Carrell - in memory and honor of their son, brothers and family members - offered a \$1 million match this past summer.

Donations continue to come in to meet the generous Carrell match campaign with \$369,000 still needed.

The Medical Center Foundation continues to explore possible funding sources such as grants, foundations, transformational gifts, and CMMC is committed to the project with debt financing, if needed. The community has voiced repeatedly that, though surveys and public forums, expanded cancer care is needed in Central Montana. Together lets make this project a reality and bring HOPE CLOSE TO HOME.

The time is now to build a Cancer Center to keep our loved ones comfortable and safe at home, now and for generations to come, while they fight and defeat cancer.
